THE BCA CODE OF CONDUCT

The British Clairvoyant Academy was established to promote and maintain a simple ethical standard for Internet based mediums and clairvoyants to follow. The BCA also trains mediums and psychics at the *Elysium Psychic School* and insists that all of its practitioners follow this simple code of conduct.

Our Code of Conduct is very simple and self-evident. However we believe that by following these simple rules the standards of Mediumship and Clairvoyance will be much improved. ALL members of the British Clairvoyant Academy and anyone working as helpers on our Chat room abide by these rules. Anyone breaking these rules will be removed from our listing and asked to remove the BCA logo from their site.

THE DON'TS

- ▶ **Don't predict a death.** A genuine psychic will know that this is impossible. It is not something that we have clairvoyant access to.
- ▶ **Don't predict accidents or other calamities** which will distress the recipient of your communication
- ▶ **Don't predict the future tell fortunes.** (We have free will. You may advise of the best course to take in order to make the best possible future.) The future is not given to anyone to know even though, from time to time, people do get premonitions which come true these are usually due to energy changes of which a psychic or medium becomes aware.
- ▶ **Don't do past life readings.** Whilst many people accept reincarnation as being factual, giving a person a reading which details one of their past lives cannot be construed as evidential. It also cannot be construed as being a psychic reading as a person can recognise themselves and their personality in a psychic reading; with a past life reading there implies a need for belief and acceptance without validation.
- ▶ **Don't play doctor.** Under no circumstances suggest someone should go against their doctor's advice; diagnose an illness or prescribe medication.
- ▶ **Don't use psychic tools when giving a mediumistic message.** Tarot cards, runes, and other divination tools are not required and should be kept completely separate from spirit communication.
- ▶ **Don't be the guru.** Stress that you are only an ordinary person or the sitter may think that you're the only person in the world that can solve their problems. (Psychiatrists call this transference)
- ▶ **Don't make exaggerated claims.** You can't guarantee that you can mediumistically communicate with the person that they want to hear from in spirit so don't ask for names or relationships to focus upon. This could be construed as claiming to 'calling up the dead'. Nor can you guarantee to solve their problems. Every sitting is an experiment.
- ▶ **Don't claim to be channelling or in trance.** Spirit communication is normally a mind to

mind exercise and claims of being in trance, or channelling can not to be proved on a spiritual site and readers making such claims will be ejected from the forum.

▶ **Do not give guide or animal readings.** While guides may make themselves known to the recipient during a communication and animals may also be brought forward by the communicating spirit it is important that readers realise that Guides and/or Angels can never be construed as evidence and are not part of an evidential communication and will usually result in an ejection from the site if such a reading continues. Animals cannot communicate, they cannot speak but they can be brought by the communicator to show that they too have survived death.

▶ **Don't embellish clairvoyance.** Keep your evidence clear. If you dry up, stop the reading. It's no good adding a load of junk from your own subconscious to the reading.

▶ **Don't ramble.** Restrict your reading to 20 - 30 minutes, any longer is discourteous to other readers who may be waiting to give communication.

▶ **Don't force yourself on people.** There's nothing worse than the overeager psychic that pushes clairvoyance onto people while waiting for a bus, for instance. Some people just aren't ready to hear from their long-dead granddad.

▶ **Don't talk of evil spirits, or lost souls** when giving a reading, such talk is not evidence and is inappropriate. (We also discourage the use of Ouija Boards by mediums or the public)

▶ **Don't allow offensive or abusive language to be used in a reading;** messages must be monitored in this respect. Make sure the words you use in the message are fully understood as beginners are not familiar with many expressions or words which are used.

THE DOS

▶ **Instil optimism.** Try to see beyond the bad events to better times. Of course there may be obstacles ahead but help the person realise the power of positive thinking. You're a useless clairvoyant if you only breed despair.

▶ **Stress free will.** A prediction that inhibits a person's growth is worthless. If, for example, you said to a young girl, "Your marriages will all end in divorce," they probably would. How could a marriage last if they're subconsciously thinking that it's doomed? Clients may remember things they've been told for the rest of their lives.

▶ **Give evidence.** To protect our visitors from unscrupulous readers and to ensure certain standards of Mediumship are maintained we MUST insist that certain conditions are met during clairvoyant readings:

1. *Notify Staff.* Before you commence a clairvoyant reading you MUST inform a member of staff who will be able to monitor the reading to ensure it complies with this Code but also to ensure you are not interrupted or harassed by other visitors.

2. *Sufficient evidence* of the spirit contact should be given so that the sitter is in no doubt as to who the communicator is i.e. how the person died, their character, attitudes, habits, stories from their life, things they said and did that prove to the sitter that spirit communication is taking place.

3. *The sitter should be told facts* and not asked them. A spirit communicator will not ask the medium to ask the sitter if this or that is correct because they would know it to be.

▶ **Cultivate spiritual values.** Make your daily life part of your psychic work. Try to change your attitudes and develop good spiritual habits.

▶ **Be good-humoured.** Try to spread a little happiness with your psychic work. Improve yourself. Psychic development is a lifelong process. Like an artist that's never satisfied with their latest painting, always try to improve on the quality of your evidence. Also, please try to remain modest in your innermost heart. We are here to help others, not prove to the world how clever we are.
